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# Climate Bond Funding Breakdown \$10+ Billion

\$3.8 Billion for safe drinking water, drought, flood, and water resilience.

\$1.5 Billion for Wildfire and Forest Resilience.

**\$1.2 Billion for Coastal Resilience.**

\$450 Million for Extreme Heat.

\$1.2 Billion for Biodiversity Protection and the acceleration of nature-based climate solutions.

\$300 Million for Climate Smart Agriculture, Sustainable Ranches, Lands, and Working Farms.

\$700 Million for Park Creation and Outdoor Access.

\$850 Million for Clean Energy.



# 2025-26 Allocations \$3.47 Billion

\$1.199 Billion for safe drinking water, drought, flood, and water resilience.

\$598 Million for Wildfire and Forest Resilience.

**\$279 Million for Coastal Resilience.**

\$110 Million for Extreme Heat.

\$390 Million for Biodiversity Protection and the acceleration of nature-based climate solutions.

\$153 Million for Climate Smart Agriculture, Sustainable Ranches, Lands, and Working Farms.

\$466 Million for Park Creation and Outdoor Access.

\$275 Million for Clean Energy.

Pre-application - project summary, location, landowner, project overview, CEQA review, other funding sources, and maps /photographs. Conduct pre-application consultation.

Continuously open, rolling application

Open to:  
non-profit organizations,  
government agencies,  
federally recognized  
tribes

Approved at four  
board meetings per  
year

Sample buckets of funding:  
Protect fish, habitat, and  
biodiversity.  
Fish habitat enhancement.  
Wildlife crossings/corridors.  
Streamflow.



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# Coastal Funding Details

State Coastal Conservancy - \$415,000,000  
(Chapter 4 - Coastal Resilience, Section 92010)  
Coastal resilience projects and programs including grants and expenditures to protect, restore and increase the resilience of beaches, bays, coastal dunes, wetlands, coastal forests, watersheds, trails and public access facilities.

California Ocean Protection Trust Fund - \$135,000,000  
(Chapter 4 - Coastal Resilience, Section 92020)  
Grants to increase resilience from the impacts of climate change. Preference to projects that conserve, protect, and restore marine wildlife and healthy ocean and coastal ecosystems, including estuarine habitat, kelp forests, eelgrass meadows, and native oyster beds, or maintain the state's system of marine protected areas, and support sustainable fisheries.

Department of Parks and Recreation - \$50,000,000  
(Chapter 4 - Coastal Resilience, Section 92040)  
Project for Sea Level Rise Adaptation Strategies in coastal state parks.



# 2025-26 State Coastal Conservancy Funding

**Coastal resilience projects and programs, including, but not limited to, grants and expenditures to protect, restore, and increase the resilience of beaches, bays, coastal dunes, wetlands, coastal forests, watersheds, trails, and public access facilities \$62,000,000**

**Coastal and combined flood management projects and activities for developed shoreline areas, including, but not limited to, areas with critical community infrastructure, including, but not limited to, transportation and port infrastructure, that is at risk of current flooding and flooding due to sea level rise \$32,835,000**



# 2025-26 Ocean Protection Council Funding

**Grants to increase resilience** from the impacts of climate change, with preference given to projects that conserve, protect, and restore marine wildlife and healthy ocean and coastal ecosystems, including, but not limited to, those that maintain the state's system of marine protected areas, and support sustainable fisheries  
\$7,500,000

**Grants to support restoration efforts** to recover rocky reef and kelp forest habitats and their associated species \$12,000,000

**Implement the California Sea Level Rise Mitigation and Adaptation Act of 2021** \$20,000,000

**Support the restoration and management of kelp ecosystems**  
\$7,000,000
